

Why the Celts are the House of Israel

The Bible, Old and New Testaments, is about the Israelites and their relationship with God and Jesus. The Roman Catholic church claimed God abandoned his wayward Israelites in favour of - you've guessed it, the church. Other churches followed. Nothing could be further from the truth.

1892 BC The 12 tribes of Israel: Jacob renamed Israel. Genesis 49:28: Israel had 12 sons, who became the 12 tribes of Israel, one of which was the tribe of Judah, later known as the Jews.

1004 BC King David of Israel. Crowned on Jacobs Pillow. God unconditionally promised to David in II Samuel 7: 10-16; Psalm 89:4, Jeremiah 31:35-36, 33:17 that David would never want a descendant to sit on his throne and rule over the nation of Israel, and Israel (note Israel, not Judah) would be a nation as long as there is a sun, moon and stars. So the nation of Israel must still be here, with her King or Queen.

927 BC King Rehoboam. From now on, I Kings 12 21-23: the "**House of Judah**" (the Tribe of Judah, the Jews) in the South is separate from the 11 tribes of the "**House of Israel**" in the North of Israel. The first mention of the word "Jews" is 1200 years after Abraham in the 12th book of the bible, II Kings 16:6.

721 BC The House of Israel carried off into captivity in Assyria II Kings 17:6 18:9. This was most of the Israelites, the 11 Tribes of Northern Israel, 2.5 million of them, taken by Shalmaneser, King of Assyria, to the Assyrian province of Scythia (North West Iraq, under Caspian Sea), where they were slaves. Note these were not from the tribe of Judah, so although they were Israelites, they were not Jews. Hoshea was King of the House of Israel, and Hezekiah was King of the House of Judah. 650 BC Kingdom of Assyria collapsed, the House of Israel were freed, and they disappeared.

650 BC The Celts arose as a huge new nation in the province of Scythia, in what had been Assyria. The Greeks named them "Celti" which means "the Tribes" The Celts migrate from Media in Scythia, moving west through Europe. The Celts are Europe's largest civilisation so far.

Mathew 10: 5-6 These twelve Jesus sent forth, saying, "Go not into the way of the Gentiles, and into any city of the Samaritans enter ye not: [6] But **go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.**" - The 12 disciples first mission was NOT to the Gentiles. The church mislead us here. Six of the 12 disciples came to Britain, the rest went to the then Celtic nations of the Galatians, Ephesians, Thessalonians, Corinthians, Philippians and to Rome, where the British Royal Family, including King Caractacus, were in residence. Jesus said, in Matthew 15:24, "I am not sent but unto the lost sheep of the House of Israel."

Surely Jesus would want to visit those who he was sent to? He was absent from the bible from age 12 to age 30. Local traditions record him at 12 places in Cornwall, including Falmouth, St Just in Roseland and St Mawes, Priddy in Somerset, and for the last two years (before he returned to Israel) at Glastonbury, where his mum Mary, and uncle, Joseph of Arimathea, are traditionally believed to be buried.

Until 1066: Britain invaded by Angles, Saxons, Jutes and Normans. They are all Celts.

1936 King George VI, who knew he was in direct line of descent through an unbroken line of monarchs from King David of Israel, and called the nation to prayer for deliverance from European domination.

Most people think the Jews, who number about 17 million today, are all the Israelites. But the Jews are only one of 12 tribes, ie about 8% of the Israelites. The lost 10 tribes must now be about 170 million people. Not many people realise that Abraham, Isaac and Jacob weren't Jews either, and wouldn't have known what a Jew was (the first Jew hadn't been born in their time). (Nor was Moses! He was a Levite.)

Most churches "re-interpret" some sections of the Bible that don't conform to their own theologies. They "cherry pick" bits out. One hundred of those passages are overleaf.

Jesus made it clear (Matthew 10:6-6 and 15:24) his mission was to the House of Israel. His disciples' mission was first to the House of Israel, and then to all nations. In the New Testament. God's aim remained the same as in the Old: To reach all nations through his chosen people, the House of Israel.

The Church is denying Christ's mission, by saying Jesus turned to the church because the Jews failed him. Christ did not fail - his mission was to the House of Israel, whose name changed (Isaiah 62:2) and migrated to a new land (2 Sam 7:10); now called the Celtic-Anglo-Saxons, Jesus's mission was a thumping great success. Only now are we deserting him, as our empty churches show, and going back into captivity, this time into what will be the brutal dictatorship of the European Union, the "Beast" in Revelation. We can avoid it only by filling our churches **NOW.**

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
